Lance Compa teaches U.S. labor law and international labor rights. Before joining the Cornell faculty in 1997, Compa directed labor law research at the NAFTA Commission for Labor Cooperation. Prior to his 1995 appointment to the commission, Compa taught labor law, employment law, and international labor rights as a Visiting Lecturer at Yale Law School and the Yale School of Management. He also practiced international labor law for unions and human rights organizations in Washington, D.C.

Professor Compa has written three reports for Human Rights Watch on workers' rights in the United States under international labor law standards. He has also conducted workers' rights investigations and reports on Cambodia, Chile, China, Haiti, Guatemala, Mexico, Sri Lanka. Professor Compa worked for many years as a trade union organizer and negotiator for the United Electrical Workers (UE) and the Newspaper Guild. Compa graduated from Fordham University and Yale Law School, and is a member of the Massachusetts Bar. He also studied abroad at the Institut d'Études Politiques in Paris, France and at the Universidad de Chile in Santiago, Chile.
