




NIH Funding for Social Science Research

- NIH FY2010 Total Funding for OBSSR \$3.53 billion
- Office of Behavioral and Social Science Research (FY10 \$26 million)
 - Research on behavioral and social processes; biopsychosocial research;
 methodology and measurement in the behavioral and social sciences
 - Issues funding announcements across institutes
 - OPPNET (FY10 \$12 million)
 - Started in July 2009 to expand NIH investment in behavioral and social science research
 - In FY12, \$30 million budget
 - Supplement existing NIH projects
